You may remember we shared with you before Summer the uniform guidance. This can also be found on our school website. We would like to draw your attention to the section around PE kit. For health and safety and so that we can promote high expectations and pupils being their BEST in all aspects of their learning, we feel it is important for children to wear a consistent and safe PE kit when in school. Historically pupils have worn their own clothes for PE, however all new PE kit purchased should be as follows:

- a white or polo plain t-shirt
- green shorts for warmer weather and indoor PE
- plain (no logos) dark blue or black jogging bottoms or leggings
- Sweatshirt (preferably without a hood for health and safety) for colder weather

There is no expectation for new purchases to be made at this time. However, if you do have these items at home or are buying the next size of kit, please follow the above guidelines. This will be followed up in September when we would expect all children to follow these guidelines.

Thurstonland First School Uniform Guide for Parents September 2023

General Appearance

No make-up, nail varnish or visible temporary tattoos. Stud earrings only which must be removed for PE. Long hair tied back and manageable hair accessories.

Uniform

Jade green sweatshirt or cardigan, white or jade green polo t-shirt (with or without logo), grey trousers, skirt or pinafore dress, green checked summer dress or shorts.

Uniform with a logo can be purchased from Term Time Wear in Huddersfield.

Swimming

Boys should wear fitted trunks and girls should wear a one-piece costume. All children should have a swimming cap. Goggles are optional.

Footwear

Black sensible, low heeled shoes and structured boots. No trainers except for physical activity. No open toed summer sandals or flip-flops.



PE Kits

White T shirt or polo shirt and green shorts for warmer weather and indoor PE. Plain, with no logos, dark blue or black jogging bottoms or leggings and a sweatshirt/hoody for colder weather.

Footwear: Trainers.

The PTA will provide your first School Bookbag when you start school and also a water bottle that will be kept in school.

Personal Items

Mobile phones, watches with alarms and inbuilt games should be left at home.

Watches are permitted if they do not disrupt learning.
